SUMMIT ACADEMY DRESS CODE

One of the goals of education is to prepare children for a future "job environment." While occupational dress may vary, there are often standards of dress for most occupations. Children need to learn to adhere to those requirements. The Summit Academy dress code is designed to help students follow a standard that promotes a positive classroom experience. Children are welcome to dress casual but modestly so as not to disrupt the classroom experience. Please discuss these policies with your children and monitor them as they leave home each week.

- 1. Shirts may be sleeveless, but no tanks or thin straps, unless covered by a sweater or jacket. Any straps must be at least the width of the student's hand.
- 2. Shorts and skirts must be fingertip length. They should not have to be adjusted to meet this standard.
- 3. No undergarments may show.
- 4. No exposed midriffs.
- 5. Holes in garments must not expose skin that would not be covered using 1-4 above.
- 6. No hats or bandanas may be worn when in the building.
- 7. The coordinator may use discretion as to other items that may cause a classroom disruption.
