Students participating in the Summit Academy Concurrent Enrollment Program may choose to participate as a full-time student. The chart above is a guide to help parents understand the difference between a part-time (home-based) student and a full time student. The full-time program is open to students who transfer from a traditional public-school setting, or students who transfer from the Summit part time program. It is important for previously home-based students and their parents to understand the impact of becoming a full-time student. The chart below outlines the differences according to Colorado homeschool law, C.R.S. 22:33:104.5.

**Home Based Law section**

Summary of Title 22, C.R.S. 33: School Attendance Law of 1963 Section 104.5, as amended

(1)	parent to choose proper education and training subject to minimum state controls	State and School District choose education and training subject to state and district regulations.
